I graduated with a Bachelor of Veterinary Science from The University of Sydney in 1983 and spent a year as a clinical officer at the Rural Veterinary Centre in Camden. I completed my PhD on equid herpesviruses at The University of Melbourne in 1988, then spent three years as a postdoctoral scientist at the Moredun Research Institute, Scotland, working mainly on infectious causes of diarrhoea in foals. Since 1991 I have been a member of academic staff at the School of Veterinary Science at The University of Melbourne. My research interests extend across bacterial and viral pathogens of animals and humans, with a particular focus on understanding their pathogenesis and epidemiology as a route to development of improved control measures, including vaccines, diagnostic tests and changes in management. My current interests include mycoplasmoses, rhodococcal pneumonia, colibacillosis, and respiratory and immunosuppressive viral diseases.
